A significant milestone was achieved during the year with the completed construction of TeamHEALTH's first purpose built, 16 bed supported living residence. Planning for Top End House Project has been underway since 2015 and through the support of the Australian Government's Building Better Regions Fund and the Northern Territory Government, we were able to make our vision a reality.

This new residential accommodation features shared living for ten people with 24-hour support and six one-bedroom units to assist people with their goal of living independently in the community. This new residence will play an important role in reducing waiting lists and providing high quality supported shared living to facilitate the wellbeing of people experiencing mental illness.

Our experience of over 30 years in supporting Territorians through their mental health journeys is only possible with the support of dedicated staff. Our staff are passionate and skilled in supporting participants to be empowered in the planning, goal setting and decision making of their own recovery journeys.

In 2018, TeamHEALTH was awarded the Excellence in Mental Health Workplace Award through the Northern Territory Mental Health Week Awards. This Award recognises our commitment to ensuring that we actively create a positive work experience for all staff and support them in their own mental health and wellbeing in the workplace.

Significant work and support has been provided throughout the year to help participants test their eligibility for the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS). As the funding landscape for mental health supports change, the ability to secure an NDIS package for participants provides certainty in being able to access, and have choice and control over, the supports they wish to access.

The ability to ensure that TeamHEALTH continues to meet high level service standards and maintain its external accreditation is essential. During the year a new system (LOGIQC) commenced implementation across the organisation to provide structure and consistency in recording information key to quality, compliance and governance requirements.

TeamHEALTH continue to maximise on opportunities for mental health promotion, education and prevention across the Territory through involvement in community events, workshops and the delivery of accredited or tailored mental health training. We are committed to raising awareness and mental health literacy to build the capacity of individuals and communities to improve outcomes associated with mental illness and its effect in our communities.

We would like to acknowledge the significant level of effort made by our staff in supporting many vulnerable people through a period of significant change to funding and how supports are delivered. With much pride and excitement, we look forward to the opportunities to improve on our work and continuing support to Territorians in their mental health.





- >> Provide a range of community mental health programs, including NDIS supports, that empower participants in their recovery journey and develop community capacity for good mental health outcomes.
